Today's Passages: Genesis 1:26-27, Revelation 5:9, Ephesians 2:14-15

Racism, in any form, is a violation of God's will and contrary to God's heart.

The bible is clear about this at the beginning, at the end and at the cross.

At the Beginning (Creation)

Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image...Genesis 1:26

From the beginning, ALL of humanity was created in God's very image, therefore being equal with each other and each life _____ valuable to God; and thus no one should be treated as inferior, ever.

At the End (Heaven)

"...by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation, ¹⁰ and you have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they shall reign on the earth."

At the cross

Ephesians 2:14–15 (NIV)
